EDUCATION AND PERSONAL BACKGROUND

Attended Akron Garfield High School and graduated January, 1950. Attended the University of Wichita and the University of Akron, studying music, accounting, and modern languages. Attended the Cleveland Institute of music while in grade and high schools and earned scholarships to college. Swimming competitively in high school, he was certified as one of the first Red Cross Certified Water Safety Instructors in the United States. In 1956, he attended machine accounting school in Chicago and was admitted to the National Association of Cost Accountants in 1957. While studying Spanish at the University of Akron he founded the Club Hispano-Americano as Charter Secretary together with Dr. Hugo Lijeron as President. In law enforcement, he has attended many seminars covering bombs, hostage negotiations, etc., has attained many certifications pertinent to police work, has served as consultant and advisor to various police and law enforcement groups in the United States and around the world and is considered an outstanding authority on officer survival training as well as the sporting aspects of karatedo. Professor Anderson has lectured widely on physical education and the martial arts and has supervised many championships and referee training seminars.
